1. Russell Cave National Monument (Alabama) Established by President John F. Kennedy on May 11th 1961
2. Ocmulgee National Monument (Georgia) Established by President Franklin Delano Roosevelt on December 23rd 1936
3. Poverty Point National Monument (Louisiana) Established by President Ronald Reagan on October 31, 1988
4. Castillo de San Marcos National Monument (Florida) Established by President Calvin Coolidge on October 15th 1924
5. Fort Matanzas National Monument (Florida) Established by President Calvin Coolidge on October 15th 1924
6. Fort Frederica National Monument (Georgia) Established by President Franklin Delano Roosevelt on May 26th 1936
7. Buck Island Reef National Monument (Virgin Islands) Established by President John F. Kennedy on December 28th 1961
8. Virgin Islands Coral Reef National Monument (Virgin Islands) Established by President Bill Clinton, January 17th 2001
9. George Washington Birthplace National Monument (Virginia) Established by President Herbert Hoover on January 23rd 1930
10. George Washington Carver National Monument (Missouri) Established by President Franklin Delano Roosevelt 1943
11. Fort Sumter National Monument (South Carolina) Established by President Harry S. Truman April 28, 1948
12. Fort Pulaski National Monument (Georgia) Established by President Calvin Coolidge October 15, 1924
